

on September 22nd. With this fun, family event, we hope to raise as much money as possible to help pregnant women on hospital bed rest.


Tickets will be on sale August 13 at www.actsofgracefoundation.org for \$25 per adult and \$15 per child. Please note that all ticket prices will

I tried to think of who I could volunteer to help and my first thought was to help families with children in the NICU because my oldest spent a week at the Swedish NICU since he was born five weeks early. I called my friend Kim Sandman, who is a nurse at Swedish, and she said she didn't think the NICU would be receptive because it could be a privacy violation. She then

> was who I was going to volunteer to help. I spent four months on bedrest with my first pregnancy after receiving an emergency cerclage for an incompetent cervix at 19

weeks. Even though I didn't have to spend those four months in the hospital, I still was unable to clean.
